IX prospective Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) candidates of Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Sri Gading, Batu Pahat, will be visiting London, England, after they emerged winners in the Raja Zarith Sofiah Wildlife Defenders Challenge 2013 recently.

A total of 27 schools ranging from national to primary schools and higher education institutions took part in the event.

The winners were judged by their creativity in designing T-shirts related to the wildlife theme, and making multimedia presentations as well as organising wildlife awareness week at their schools.

The Sri Gading team who formed the group Wildlife Avengers is set to visit London from June 16 to 20.

Among the places that they will visit include the London Zoo, London Wetland Centre and the Natural History Museum.

Wildlife Avengers leader Nur azreen Hamzah, 17, said that it had been an exciting experience for members of the group to be able to spread awareness on environmental conservation and wildlife.

Nurazreen said that the programme had helped in fostering leadership qualities as it allowed the group to organise a variety of activities ranging from campaigning to staging exhibitions at the school.

"We are looking forward to exploring London.

"We also feel honoured that the consort of the Sultan, Raja Zarith Sofiah Sultan Idris Shah, was at the closing ceremony to present the prizes to us," said Nurazreen, adding that the winners are grateful to Johor Corporation (JCorp) for organising the event through its subsidiary Kulim (Malaysia) Bhd.
